Roland Frank Alewine, 52, of San Antonio, Texas passed away May 17, 2018.

After earning the rank of Eagle Scout, and graduating from Tuloso-Midway High School in Corpus Christi, Tx, Roland served in the United States Marine Corps. His awards include: Sharpshooter Rifle, Sharpshooter Pistol, Sea Service, and Good Conduct Medal.
